
Introduction Peru


Now he wants to go to all the services and when the other children saw this, they too wanted to attend and to be prayed for.


Memory Verse

Ezekiel 36:25

I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

Give each child a paper with a heart drawing (resource p. 127). Have them write the Bible verse inside of the heart. Then, have them cut the heart into 6 pieces, and have them glue it back together on top of another piece of paper or cardboard. This will illustrate the idea of getting a new heart and spirit.





Bible Lesson

God's Special Gift – A New Heart

Fzekiel 36:26

Ask the children to prepare a drama of the following scenario. If you have a large group of children, you could divide the group into drama teams, with at least 4 people on each team. The actors are: a rebellious young person, a Christian friend, a doctor, a nurse(s). After viewing the drama(s), ask the discussion questions that follow.

<u>Scenario</u>: Two friends are talking. The one is a Christian and is talking to the other about his rebellious/disobedient life. The Christian lists several of the ways that his friend has gotten into trouble. The rebellious friend is nonchalant about the conversation. The Christian friend asks the other how he feels about his life. He responds "I don't feel anything. I haven't felt anything for a very long time." The Christian friend's answer is, "I know what is wrong with you. You have a heart of stone."

"How is that possible?" asks the rebellious friend. The Christian goes on to tell about the nation of Israel, how they had forgotten about God, had worshipped idols, and done all sorts of bad things. Yet, God never forgot about them. He told them that he would make them clean again; and take away their hearts of stone and give them a heart of flesh. In the same way, God is ready to help the rebellious friend too. If he wants a new heart, God can give him one.

The rebellious friend asks to receive a new heart. So, the Christian calls a nurse and doctor and asks them to make an appointment to do surgery — to change his friend's heart of stone.

They dramatically place the boy/girl on a table and prepare him/her for surgery; pretending to take out the heart of stone (using a rock) and making it clunk loudly when they take it out. Then they replace the heart with a heart of flesh (a red balloon or soft pillow). (The Dr and nurse should make funny comments and actions throughout the surgery.)

After the surgery, the rebellious youth is a changed person and is so excited that he can now feel God's love and presence with his new heart of flesh.

Discussion

- Obviously, God does not take out our heart and give us a new one. Make sure that the children understand that God changes our thoughts, our desires, our actions; so it is like receiving a new heart.
- Why do you think God used the term (in Ezekiel) "your heart of stone."
- God wants to change our heart to be like flesh to be teachable and open to His guidance in our lives. How can we have a heart of flesh?

Game—Fruit Basket Upset

.All of the children need to choose the name of a local fruit: for instance banana, apple, mango, pineapple, etc. When each child has their fruit name, one of the children or the leader begins walking around the room and saying "I am going to the Mercado and I am going to buy a banana. The person who is banana gets up and follows the person as they continue calling out the fruits they are going to buy. Each fruit gets up as they are called and follows the leader. When there is a large group of the fruit/children following the leader, the leader calls out "se rompe mi canasta," or "my basket broke" and all the children have to find there seat as quickly as possible. The last one to sit down becomes the new buyer.







- 1. For leaders to rise up in the area.
- 2. That the people are encouraged to follow the Lord despite their physical circumstances.
- That we may one day have a teaching center for the pastors and leaders in Iquitos.
- 4. That God be glorified in all we do.
- 5. That we may reach as many people as possible with the gospel.
- 6. That our current churches grow strong and have their own church plants.

Activity

Painted paperweight

You will need: a stone for every student, large enough to write Ez. 36:26 on the front. (Only write the reference, not the entire verse.)

Remind the students of the memory verse. Give them all a stone that they will paint red. (The color red will remind them of Jesus' blood that was shed for their sins.) Older children can outline a heart on the rock and paint within the lines. When the paint is dry, have them write with a black marker the Bible reference over the red paint – Ez. 36:26. This rock can be used as a paperweight and will always be a reminder of the new heart that we have as Christians.
